Do all of	the following requirements (1-3)
1.	Participate in horsemanship training to include at least the following preparation:
_	a. Demonstrate wearing appropriate riding clothing, footwear, and headgear.
-	b. Describe how you should behave and how your voice affects a horse's behavior.
_	c. Explain Basic Barn/Stable Safety Rules, including: No loud voices; No running; Pick up and put away supplies and Tack as you go; No climbing on hay, gates, fences, etc.; Never ride or handle your horse alone; Any additional barn/stable rules.
_	d. Describe safe riding rules.
_	e. Demonstrate how to approach a horse safely and how to fasten a lead rope.
_	f. Demonstrate leading a horse with a lead rope and securing it to a hitching post.
-	g. Demonstrate the use of the various grooming tools used in caring for a horse such as brushes, currycombs, picks and products.
_	h. Demonstrate how to tack your horse using either Western or English equipment.
2.	Participate in horseback riding training to include at least the following riding skills:
_	a. Demonstrate how to mount, sit, and dismount a horse.
_	b. Demonstrate starting, stopping, and backing up the horse at marked locations
_	c. Demonstrate walking the horse in a straight line
_	d. Demonstrate walking the horse in a circle
_	e. Demonstrate walking the horse through a weaving or serpentine course.



_	f. Demonstrate trotting the horse in a straight line
_	g. Demonstrate trotting the horse in a circle
_	h. Demonstrate trotting the horse through a weaving or serpentine course.
